MINISTRY OF LANDS AND NATURAL RESOURCE HAS BEEN WORKING TOGETHER WITH MEDICI LAND GOVERNANCE

For the implementation of the National Land Titling Programme. As of the end of September 2022, more than 58,000 certificates of title have been handed over to landowners who have been successfully captured under the Systematic Land titling Program.

The beneficiaries of these legal documents are from areas within Lusaka, Kafue, Chilanga in Lusaka Province, and Kitwe and Ndola on the Copperbelt Province.

To date, a total of 271,109 parcels have been enumerated with ownership information capture; and 139,197 offer letters have been issued out, which will lead to the issuance of certificates of title once the landowners pay the minimum titling fee.

The month of September 2022 was characterized by field activities of sensitisation, public display and community verification and enumeration in Chingola, Luanshya, Mufulira, Kalulushi and Chililabombwe Districts on Copperbelt Province.

THE NUMBER OF FEMALE LANDOWNERS NUMBER THE NATIONAL LAND TITLING PROGRAMME,

the Project has begun tracking the number of female sole owners, male sole owners, female associated owners, and joint owners. This is meant to ensure that women equally benefit from the titling program and in order to identify barriers for women to obtain their certificates of title.



The percentage of number of titles with associated female owners was 29% for data collected in 2018 (pilot project), today it stands at 56% since the commencement and roll out of the National Land Titling Programme
